'Live Wereldmuziek Café' (*Live Worldmusic Café*) is a series of concerts in which 'traditional' music form many different origins will be on the stage at **Theater De Omval** in **Diemen.** The LaagLand Ensemble organises and has a 'musical encounter' with other musicians and ensembles that also play traditional music and-/or instrumensts.



On Sunday October 12th 2025, Het Laagland Ensemble will play

traditional music, mostly originating from South-eastern Europa: de Balkan en surroundings, and other places. The musicians play traditional instruments: the *tárogató* – a Hungarian/Rumanian instrument with a special sound, somewhere between clarinet, hobo, sax.... (Jan Rijnierse) and the *accordeon* – an orchestra in itself with melody, bass and rythm in one (Jan Rademaker). The combination of these two is a pleasing tot he ear.



The *tárogató* (Hungarian) or *taragot* (Rumanian) is in existance since the end of the 19th century. It has been develloped from both the Turkish zurna and the soprano-saxophone.

On Sunday October 12th Live Wereldmuziek Café also presents the 'premiere' of a new

project: Tarogato & Cimbalom, with Reinier Hille Riss Lambers (cimbalom) and Jan Rijnierse (tarogato). These two



instruments have found their present form in the last period of the 19th century in what was Hungary then. Their sounds are incomparable with other instruments. Together downright enchanting! For these two musicians a dreamed-off combination. For this project we looked



for diversity and originality. In Gypsy an Klezer music this combination of instruments is not much found, in tradional Hungarian and Rumanian music much more often....

The repertoire we are playing is still developing. The more you work on that, the more comes in sight. We are happy to be insprired by the

sounds and vituosity of many Greater and Smaller Masters: Joszef Balogh, Ernö Kállai Kiss, Andras Puporka, Laszlo Kiss Gy., Gerrit Boeschoten and many others.
